

## Noah B. Mamet



Noah B. Mamet was confirmed as U.S. Ambassador to Argentina by the U.S. Senate on December 2, 2014, and accredited by the Argentine Government on January 16, 2015.

Ambassador Mamet has been a top advisor to various Democratic presidential candidates and numerous Senate, House and Gubernatorial campaigns.

During the 2012 election, he served on the Obama-Biden National Finance Committee and hosted events with President Obama and Vice President Biden in numerous cities.

Ambassador Mamet founded the consulting firm Noah Mamet & Associates LLC in 2004, after serving for seven years as Senior Advisor for the House Democratic Leader, Congressman Richard A. Gephardt. Over the last nine years, he has provided consulting services for private sector companies and nonprofit organizations such as the Clinton Global Initiative, National Democratic Institute, Global Green USA and the U.S. Fund for UNICEF.

Ambassador Mamet has worked closely with national and international political leaders, including President Bill Clinton, Secretary Hillary Clinton and Secretary of State Madeleine Albright.

In 2007, he was a member of a high level international delegation representing the DC-based National Democratic Institute to monitor and report on the first openly democratic election in Sierra Leone, Africa, since that country's civil war.

In addition, he has consulted for many CEO's of U.S. companies in various sectors, including real estate, entertainment, banking, sports management, hospitality and alternative energy.

Ambassador Mamet has worked on numerous philanthropic causes, including education reform efforts in California. This experience led to Ambassador Mamet's strong support for domestic and international educational exchange programs.

Ambassador Mamet previously served on the executive board of Green Dot Public Schools, the largest public charter school operator in California and a leading catalyst for education reform nationwide. In addition, he was a board member of NatureBridge, a nonprofit organization which teaches math and science to students through innovative approaches, such as field trips to national and state parks throughout the United States.

Ambassador Mamet has been a member of the American Council of Young Political Leaders. A graduate of the University of California at Los Angeles, he most recently lived in Marina del Rey, California before Buenos Aires, Argentina.
